From the Principal:

Time does fly! With the holidays over, we are now well and truly into the second half of the year. Our students have slipped straight back into routine and there is some great teaching and learning happening.

Welcome to Scaddan Primary School

I would like to formally welcome Mrs Rooney back to the Scaddan Primary School community and to the role of Senior Room teacher. Mrs Rooney comes with a broad range of knowledge and experience that is already benefiting our students. We look forward to having Mrs Rooney on board for the rest of the year.

We also welcome Klaire Wohling, who has recently enrolled, and her family to our amazing school!

School Development Day

While the students were enjoying their last day of holidays, our staff members were working hard during our scheduled School Development Day. For the first part of the day we joined all the primary schools in the area (town and outlying), to learn about how to differentiate effectively in Mathematics. After this session we then joined with Munglinup and Salmon Gums, to focus on learning about Brightpath. Brightpath is a heavily researched writing assessment tool that was developed by University of Western Australia and has been endorsed by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority. The process of Brightpath involves teachers comparing their students' work to numerous exemplars to arrive at a scaled score. This process promotes reliable teacher judgements that are comparable across classrooms, schools and time.

Census and NCCD Data Collection

Friday 4 August is the Semester 2 census. This is when we submit our student enrolments to the Department of Education. The purpose of this census is different to that of Semester 1, being that it is for statistical purposes to account for student whereabouts.

We will also be submitting student data about those students we make educational adjustments for as part of the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability. The aim of this process is to enable governments to target support and resources in schools to help all students reach their potential. Any data submitted to the Department of Education is de-identified prior to being passed on to Federal Government. If you would like more information about this process please contact myself to discuss.









NAPLAN Online

From 2019 NAPLAN will go online. There are numerous advantages to this;

-Better assessment and more precise results: NAPLAN Online uses a tailored test design, where the test automatically adapts to the student's performance and asks questions that match their achievement level. -Faster turnaround of results: Schools should receive data by the end of Term 2 rather than the end of Term 3. This will allow schools to respond to learning needs quickly.

-More engaging: Research conducted has shown that the students have engaged well with the electronic tests.

To ensure our school is ready to make this leap, we have elected to trial NAPLAN Online in 2018. Prior to the end of the term, we will participate in a School Readiness Test. More information about this will be released closer to the testing date.

Nature Playground Meeting

Thank you to everyone who came to the Nature Playground Meeting last Thursday. This is a community partnership project and in order to meet our final goal the school, parents and the wider community will be working together. The aim is to have this project completed by the end of term. To find out how you can help with the next phase of this project, please come along to our next assembly in Week 4. Therapy Focus Competition

As mentioned in the last newsletter, Bevan Norwood's art work made it into the Top 100 in the Therapy Focus Competition. This was an amazing achievement as **4341** entries were received from **58** schools! Unfortunately, Bevan was not selected in the Top 20, but Scaddan is very proud of his achievement!


Out of Office




