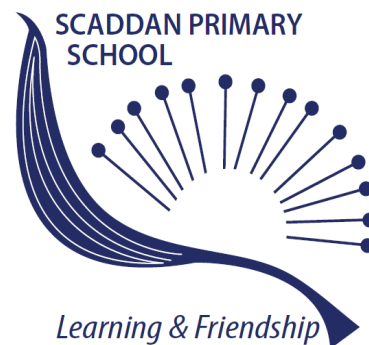

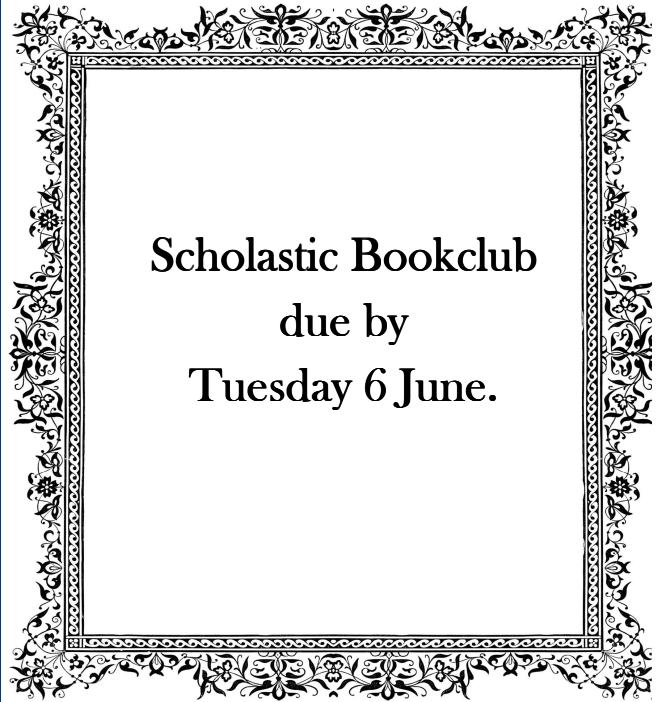

Call out: We are chasing one or two bales of pea hay to keep our veggies warm. If you have a spare bale lying around, please contact Mrs Guest.

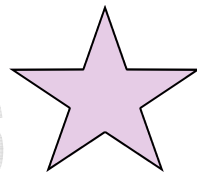

Kitchen Garden Program!

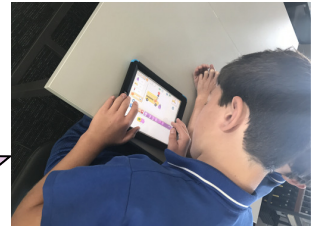

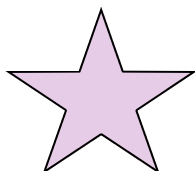
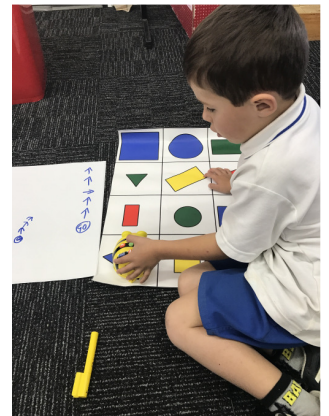
Design and Technologies



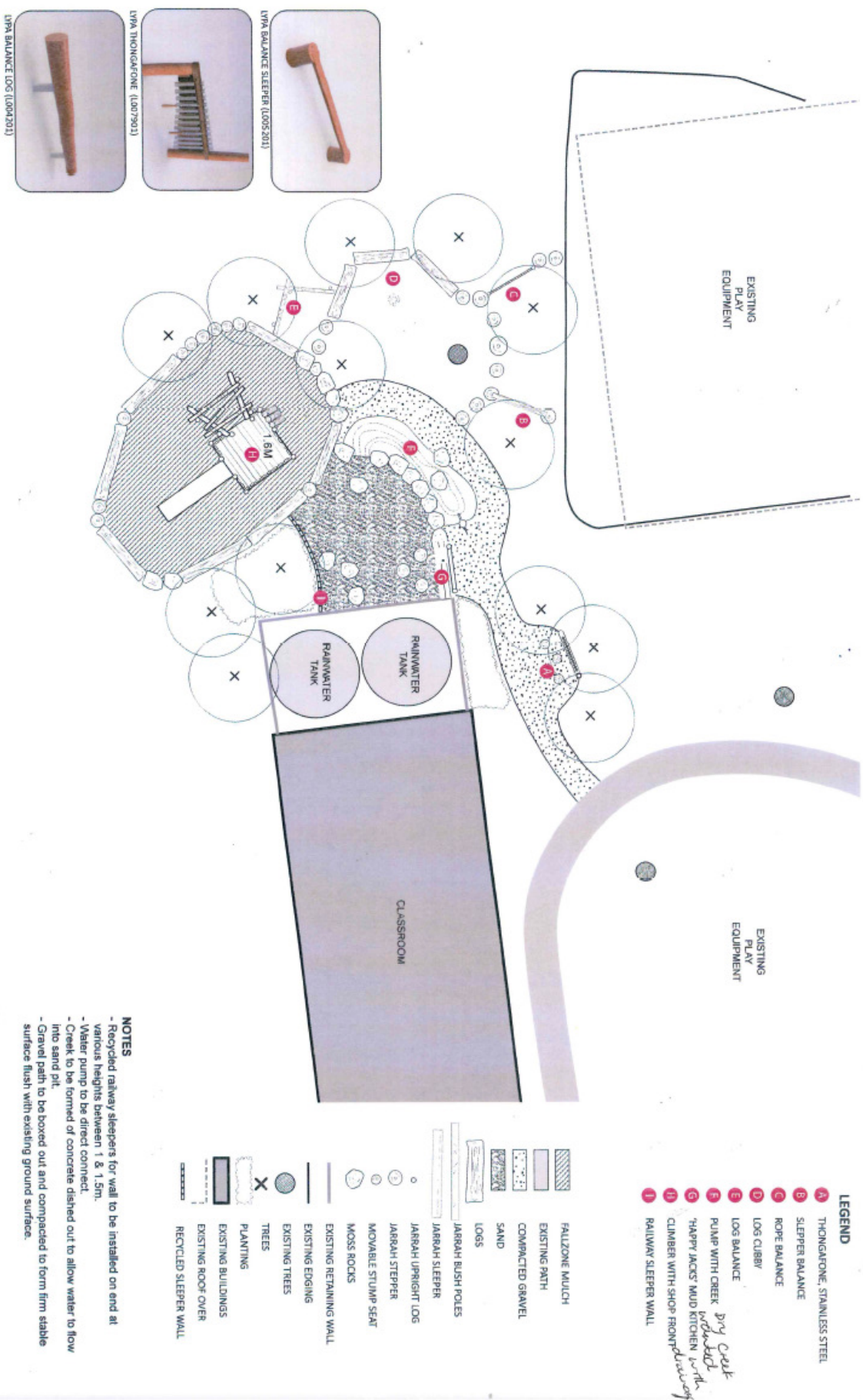

May highlights in the Esperance Arts Calendar include.

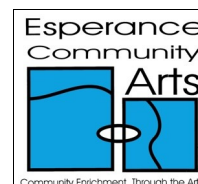
