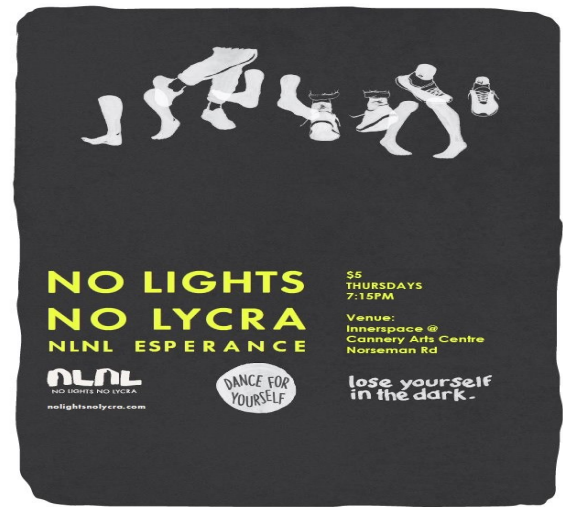

Make a Movie, Make a Stand, Make a Difference

The Your SAY, Your Call Competition 2017 is a collaboration between WA Police, Students Advising Youth (SAY) Project, and Constable Care Child Safety Foundation's youth brand, Your Call. It is proudly sponsored by the Western Australian Lions Drug Education Foundation and NIB. This year's competition will focus on *the negative impact of alcohol and other drug misuse on youth mental health*. In groups of up to three, students are invited to research and compile a short film (120 seconds or under) expressing their view on how alcohol and drugs relate to this.

The top film will **win a \$2,400 JB HIFI Voucher**. Vouchers and prizes are also available for 2nd – 10th placed films.

The deadline for submitting applications is the 1 June 2017. An entry must consist of; a short film that is 120 seconds or less in length (inclusive of any credits) that **addresses the negative impact of alcohol and other drug misuse on youth mental health**. When you submit your application on the www.yourcall.rocks website, you will be required to answer a set of questions relating to your film and its content. Schools and community/youth groups wishing to register and participate after this deadline must contact the Community Engagement Division (08) 9222 1300.
