#### *A good reason to participate:*

*Landfill sites pose a threat to local ground water supplies. Every time it rains, water drains through all the rubbish and picks up chemicals and hazardous materials from whatever is in the landfill site. This includes chemicals used in clothing and textiles such as dyes and bleaches. The water collects at the bottom of the landfill, often in large amounts and can be up to 200 times more toxic than raw sewage.*

The four nomination categories are:


- Community Citizen of the Year Award
