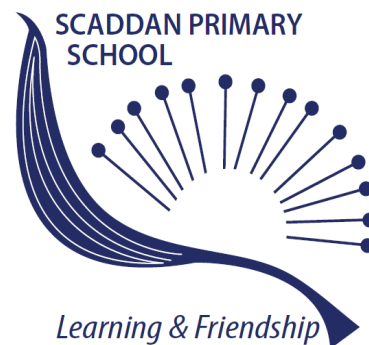

Junior Room

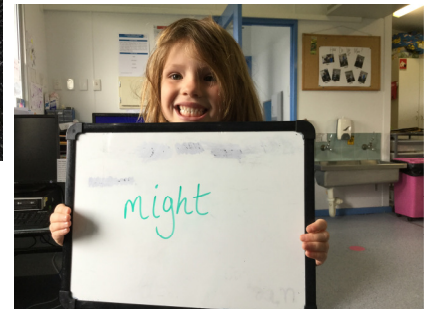
