NAPLAN Online

This year our year three and five students will be taking their NAPLAN assessments 'online'. Scaddan Primary is part of an extensive trial for NAPLAN Online in 2018. Year five students will complete all the assessments on computer, while year three students will continue to complete their writing assessment on paper and all other assessments online. Later this term the students will be taking part in a 'practice' assessment to ensure our technology will cope with the process and more importantly students will become familiar with the online test environment.

It is envisaged, that from 2019, all schools throughout Australia will complete the assessments online.

On-entry Assessment Program – Kindy to Year 2.

Last week all Junior room parents would have received information about the On-entry Assessment taking place in the junior room over the next few weeks.

The main purpose of the On-entry Assessment Program is to provide us with information about the skills and understandings that a child brings to school.

Conducting this assessment early in the year ensures that Miss Shoobert has information about the current skills and understandings of each child to assist in the planning and development of targeted learning programs that address the needs of each individual and identify children who may require early intervention or extension. This approach is supported by national and international research into the early identification of students' literacy and numeracy skills.

If you have any queries regarding the assessment, please see either Miss Shoobert or myself.

Shire of Esperance Banners in the Terrace Competition



Banners in the Terrace is one of the state's largest community arts projects, featuring banners from Councils from all over Western Australia, which go on display along St Georges and Adelaide Terraces, during the Annual Local Government Convention in July/August each year.

2018 Local Design Competition

Individuals, schools, community groups and professional artists within the Shire of Esperance are invited to submit designs for the 2018 competition. Councillors will vote for the best local design to be submitted into the WALGA state-wide Banners in the Terrace competition.

A prize of \$100 gift voucher from a local business to the winner and \$50 gift vouchers for two runners-up. The 2018 theme is 'Ready and Relevant' which may be reflected in your design (optional).

The Shire arranges for the local winning design to be digitally printed and exhibited along St Georges and Adelaide Terraces in the City of Perth during the annual WA Local Government Convention. The local finalist will also be in the running to win the state-wide 2018 Banners in the Terrace Competition.

The winning design, as chosen by the Shire of Esperance, is transferred to a 3.4m x 1.5m banner and will fly in St Georges Terrace as a part of Local Government Week. The banner will be on display with up to 80 other WA local government banners.

Entries must be submitted to the Shire of Esperance by Friday 13 April 2018.

Banner Entry Information

Entries to the Banners in the Terrace competition are displayed for two weeks along St Georges and Adelaide Terrace allowing communities and regions throughout Western Australia to showcase local talents to thousands of people visiting the Perth CBD

The winning design, as chosen by the Shire of Esperance, is transferred to a 3.4m x 1.5m banner and will fly in St Georges Terrace as a part of Local Government Week. The banner will be on display with up to 80 other WA local government banners.

The theme for the banner is 'Ready and Relevant'.

Banner Criteria:

- The design should promote a bright, positive image of Esperance
- The design should use large and bold images as minor details will not be seen when the banners are on display
- The design can be drawn, painted or digitally created and printed
- The word ESPERANCE must appear in large, clear lettering
- Only one side of the banner should have artwork

The Banners will be judged on:

- Creative composition
- Use of colour and creativity
- Artistic merit
- Individuality, boldness and humour
- Is it easy to identify where the banner comes from?
- Can you read the ESPERANCE name?
- Can you identify something about the place?

Entries must be submitted on paper and must be 40cm high X 17.5cm wide.

Entries must be submitted to the Shire of Esperance by Friday 13 April 2018.

Please include the following information with your submission: your name, contact phone number and email address.

Please note: The winning design will be made into a full scale banner 3.4m high x 1.5m wide, for the Banners in the Terrace display. The Shire of Esperance will cover the cost of banner construction and assist the winner with converting their design to a full scale version.
